Open Society Foundations/ University of Cambridge Scholarships 2011-12

NOTES FOR APPLICANTS

THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Open Society Foundations/ University of Cambridge Scholarships, which are jointly funded by the Open Society Foundation-London and the University of Cambridge, are intended to provide opportunities for postgraduate study in selected fields in the United Kingdom for scholars and young professionals who demonstrate both academic excellence and the potential to become leaders, decision makers and opinion formers in their home countries. Applicants should have excellent academic qualifications, a clear and precise proposal describing what they wish to study, and a fluent command of the English language. The scholarships cover all university and college fees for an eligible MPhil degree course for up to one year, travel to and from the UK, and basic living expenses for a single person.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicants must be citizens of and resident in one of the following countries during the academic year in which they apply for the award: Afghanistan, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo, Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia (*Nizhny Novgorod, Irkutsk, Samara, Vladivostok, Tomsk, Kazan and Magadan*) and Ukraine. Applicants who are temporarily out of the country (for a total period of less than three consecutive months) may be treated as being resident.
- Demonstrate exceptional academic potential, familiarity with the chosen field of study and clear commitment to open society goals. This requirement will be treated as of considerable importance in the selection process, and applicants should be sure to complete Section B (6) of the Graduate Admission and Scholarship Application Form (GRADSAF) fully and appropriately;
- Applicants should be planning to return to their home country at the end of the period of study.
- Already hold (or expect to hold by the time of taking up the award) a first degree of an equivalent standard to a good UK second-class Honours degree.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have not previously studied outside of their home country.
- Applicants will be required to have passed an English proficiency test (TOEFL or IELTS) before being offered a Scholarship. The minimum requirement for some of the courses available is in TOEFL 600 (250 in the computer-based test) or IELTS 7.0; however most courses require the higher minimum requirement of IELTS 7.5, and some IELTS 8.0. Please refer to the University of Cambridge Graduate Studies Prospectus for further details.

Please note that if you have applied, or are applying, for other grants, fellowships or scholarships with the Open Society Foundations you should alert us to this in your application. While you may apply under more than one scheme simultaneously, you can be awarded only one Open Society Foundations scholarship or grant for a given period.

Employees, employees' relatives (or former employees who have left employment less than two years before) of the Educational Advising Centers or local Open Society Foundations representations directly involved in the Open Society Foundations Scholarship Programs administration in the region and the participating universities will not be eligible to apply for these awards.

HOW TO APPLY

Scholars should obtain information about the relevant degree and its requirements by consulting the University's Graduate Studies Prospectus, which is available online at the link to the website <u>http://www.admin.cam.ac.uk/univ/gsprospectus/</u>. Application forms (GRADSAF) are available from the Cambridge University website <u>http://www.admin.cam.ac.uk/offices/gradstud/prospec/apply/applynow/index.html#paper</u>. It is also available in printed form from the local representatives of Open Society Foundations.

Applicants shall check the requirements for individual courses as additional supporting materials such as written work might be needed.

Local representatives of Open Society Foundations will assist you by arranging for your application to be sent to Cambridge, and will also arrange for payment of the £35 application fee. Please send your GRADSAF (including Graduate Application Cover, Packing List, Eligibility Requirements Self-Assessment Form and all required supporting documents) to the address below by **19 November 2010**. Applications will not be accepted after this deadline.

Applicants should mention Open Society Foundations/ Cambridge Scholarships in the funding section of GRADSAF.

Scholars wishing to submit further applications for further courses must apply to the University directly, applications that arrive directly to University will not be considered for the Open Society Foundations/ Cambridge Scholarships.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

- All completed applications received by local representatives of Open Society Foundations by the deadline will be forwarded to the University of Cambridge. Academic staff at the University will compile a short-list.
- Short-listed applicants will be invited for an interview and an English language test in their home country in May 2011. You should keep yourself free around this time. You will be informed by your local scholarship co-ordinator in late April/early May 2011 whether you have been shortlisted or not.
- Interviews will be carried out by representatives of OSF-London in certain cases, there may also be a panel member representing the interests of the University.
- The final awards will be decided jointly by the University and OSF-London. Candidates will be informed by the end of May/early June. In addition, certain candidates may be offered reserve places for scholarships, which means that there is a **possibility** that they will be given a scholarship, if one of the successful candidates withdraws from the program.

Please note that the staff at your local representative office is not involved in the decision-making process. They will tell you as soon as they can whether or not you have been successful. Please understand they will not be able to inform you until they have been told by the University of Cambridge and OSF-London.

Please note that all successful applicants will be expected to attend a one-month preparatory academic writing summer school in August 2011. The Open Society Scholarship Programs Pre-Academic Summer Program is designed to prepare Open Society Scholarship Programs grantees for a successful academic experience in the UK. Successful applicants will be provided with the opportunity to refine their research and writing skills through intensive courses in academic writing and social sciences. The exact date and location of the summer school will be available at a later stage in the selection process
