

FINANCIAL AID

- The majority of CEU students receive internal or external financial aid.*
 Various types of funding packages are available for Master's students:
- are available for Master's students: CEU fellowships, tuition waivers, and external scholarships and financial aid. Many Master's students receive full or partial CEU fellowships, which include a full fution waiver, housing in CEU's Residence Center, health insurance and a full or partial living stipend.

 Tuition waiver packages include full (100%) or partial (50-80%) tuition waiver, and health insurance.

 Nearly 90% of the doctoral students receive a full CEU fellowship that covers all tuition fees and a generous living allowance for up to three years.

 CEU administers a number of external scholarship and financial aid programs, including the Erasmus Mundus scholarships, US federal loans, and other private and public funding options.
